Front Panel



1. Master volume

The master level control will adjust the output level of the line outputs (L and R)

2. Input gain level control (Microphone)

This potentiometer controls the input level of the analog microphone input.

3. 3-pin XLR (Balanced) – For condenser microphones with +48V phantom power or dynamic microphones.

Please refer to P.36 for the connection method of different types of microphones and instruments..

4. Headphone output

This output jack accepts a standard 1/4" stereo TRS headphone connector.

5. Headphone level control

This potentiometer controls the output level of the headphone output.

Rear Panel



1. Power supply connector (USB Type C)

The USolo Live is USB-bus powered. If your computer does not supply sufficient power, connect an ICON 5VDC power supply adapter to this jack.

Alternatively, you may try to use your smart phone power adapter with the correct cable type (USB Type C). Normally it should work and provide enough power to the device.

(Note: You may purchase the power adapter from ICON distributors/dealers near you)

(Note: An external power adapter is needed if the USolo Live is used as a standalone unit without a Mac or PC)

2. USB 2.0 connector (Type C)

Connect this port with the 'Type C' USB cable provided to your Mac/PC or your iOS device camera kit's USB connector. Your Mac/PC must have a USB2.0 connector in order to run the full speed of the USolo Live.

3. Smart Device I/O (Digital - Type C & Analog - 3.5mm TRRS)

These ports allow you to connect your smart device and your Mac/PC simultaneously, so you may process the audio signal with your Mac/PC, before the signal is delivered to the smart device for a live streaming application.

Digital - Type 'C' jack for connecting directly to the digital jack of the smart device (OTG adapter required)

Analog - TRRS stereo jack for connecting directly to smart device's audio I/O

4. Stereo output L/R

This is an unbalanced analog output on a standard 3.5mm stereo connector.

Top Panel



1. Mic/Inst Button

Press the Mic/Inst button to switch between a Mic and Instrument.

2. +48 Phantom Power

Press to supply +48V phantom power to the associated XLR input. This phantom power circuit is suitable for most condenser microphones.

Mac driver installation

The USolo Live is a class compliant device. Therefore, no driver installation is needed for the Mac. Additionally, it fully supports iOS devices by connecting the unit to a camera kit.





Mixer control panel(Mac)

The mixers work like a matrix mixer. Activate and adjust the corresponding input or output channel level. They are very useful and make your inputs and outputs very flexible. You may route any of your input(s) to any output(s).



1. HW In 1/2 level metering

Shows the hardware 1/2 input level. (HW In 1/2).

2. HW Out 1/2 level metering

Shows the hardware 1/2 output level. (HW Out 1/2).

3. LoopBack In 1-8 level metering

Show the LoopBack 1/2, 3/4, 5/6 & 7/8 input level.

4. LoopBack Out 1-8 level metering

Show the LoopBack 1/2, 3/4, 5/6 & 7/8 output level.

5. Link switch

Switch to adjust both channels' levels simultaneously.

6. Mute switch

Switch to mute the corresponding channel.

7. "0dB" switch

Switch to instantly adjust the corresponding channel to "0dB" level.

8. Gain control fader

Slide to adjust the gain level for the corresponding channel.

9. Inputs & Outputs Matrix switches

Switch to turn On/Off the corresponding input channel route to the corresponding output channel. Remember, you may route any input(s) to any output(s).

10. Mixer Presets

6 Mixer-Preset button slots are available for saving or loading your routing channel settings.







Introducing ProDriver4, the leading edge in audio innovation for stage, studio and streaming from ICON Pro Audio. The Pro Driver audio system supplies you with the most reliable tools for almost any audio application - in the moment - right when you need them. The heart of the system is our driver, employing breakthrough technology and zero latency monitoring. The user interface makes it easy to grab, route and re-direct audio from any source in your computer with our virtual signal router. Use the Pro Driver Plugin Host to connect your favorite VST, Audio Units and Direct X plugins. Run ProDriver4 in standalone mode or with your favorite DAW. Save your favorite plugin chains as presets and recall them during your session or live on stage in real time.

Mixer control panel(Windows)

There are two different audio drivers including "WDM" (Windows Driver Model) and "ASIO" (Audio Stream Input and Output) within the ICON Pro Audio audio interface driver. WDM is widely used for daily software such as media player and ASIO is mainly used for most trecording software such as Logic Pro. The advantage of ASIO is that it has much lower latency than WDM and this is very important when you are recording with a heavy plugin load of plugins. Actually, most of the daily software does not support ASIO driver and using WDM only, in that case you just simply need to use the HW channel (Hardware channels). Below please find some explanations on the different terminology for each channel type.

1. HW IN (Hardware Channel IN)

This means the hardware input channels including the microphones or internal input channels

2. HW Out (Hardware Channel OUT)

This means the hardware output channels including the headphone or line out output channels

3. VC Out (Virtual Channel OUT)

This only exists on ASIO driver and it is a virtual channel that's output signal goes to ASIO VC IN

4. VC In (Virtual Channel IN)

This only exists on ASIO driver and it is a virtual channel that's input signal is coming from ASIO VC Out

5. LoopBack (LoopBack Channel)

ASIO internal loopback channel (e.g. ASIO VC Out signal goes to ASIO VC IN)

On the mixer control panel, there are four different types of ASIO channels that you can manipulate.

1. USolo Live Hardware channels (HW In 1/2 & HW Out 1/2)

These are the hardware input and output channels on the USolo Live .

2. USolo Live Virtual channels (VC In 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6), (VC Out 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6)

These are the input and output virtual channels that relate to the WDM.

For example: WDM Out 1/2 linked to VC In1/2

VC Out1/2 linked to WDM In1/2

3. USolo Live Loopback channels (LB 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6)

These are the ASIO loop-back channels.



By activating different cross points, you may route the corresponding signal to your desired channels.

- HW Input 1/2 level metering
 Showing the hardware 1/2 input level (HW In 1/2).
- HW Output 1/2 level metering
 Showing the hardware 1/2 output level (HW Out 1/2).
- 3. VC In 1/2 (Virtual) input level metering Showing the WDM 1/2 output level (VC In 1/2).
- **4. VC In 3/4 (Virtual) input level metering** Showing the WDM 3/4 output level (VC In 3/4).
- VC Out 1/2 (Virtual) output level metering Showing the ASIO 1/2 VC output level (VC Out 1/2).
- 6. VC Out 3/4 (Virtual) output level metering Showing the ASIO 3/4 VC output level (VC Out 3/4).
- VSC In 1/2 (Virtual) input level metering Showing the WDM 1/2 output level (VSC In 1/2).

8. VSC Music In 1/2 (Virtual) input level metering

Showing the WDM 1/2 output level (VSC music In 1/2).

9. VSC Out 1/2 (Virtual) output level metering

Showing the ASIO 1/2 VC output level (VSC Out 1/2).

10. VSC Music Out 1/2 (Virtual) output level metering

Showing the ASIO 1/2 VC output level (VSC music Out 1/2).

11. Loopback 1/2

Showing the ASIO loop-back 1/2 channel's level metering.

12. Loopback 3/4

Showing the ASIO loop-back 3/4 channel's level metering.

13. Loopback 5/6

Showing the ASIO loop-back 5/6 channel's level metering.

14. Link switch

Switch to adjust both channels level simultaneously.

15. Mute switch

Switch to mute the corresponding channel.

16. "0dB" switch

Switch to instantly adjust the corresponding channel to "0dB" level.

17. Gain control fader

Slide to adjust the gain level for the corresponding channel.

18. Inputs & Outputs Matrix switches

Switch to turn On/Off the corresponding input channel route to the corresponding output channel. The matrix is very useful and makes your inputs and outputs very flexible. You may route any of your input(s) to any output(s).

19. Mixer Presets

6 Mixer-Presets button slots are available for saving or loading your routing channel settings.

Settings (Sample rate and latency settings)

Click the "Setting" button to launch the settings window.













Grouping a Preset

Edit plug-ins in a preset

Click the "Pencil & Paper" button on the selected preset slot will launch the plugin rack screen where you would see 6 different routing blocks.

- 1. ProDriver Input routing block with orange connections
 Depending on the number of I/O that your audio interface is equipped with, you will see a number of connections in orange. They are representative of the input channels of the audio interface.
- 2. ProDriver Output routing block with orange connections
 Depending on the number of I/O that your audio interface is equipped with,
 you will see a number of connections in orange. They are representative of the
 output channels of the audio interface.
- **3. ProDriver MIDI Input routing block with green connection** Depending on if your audio interface is equipped with MIDI I/O, you will see a connection in green. This is representative of the MIDI input channel of the audio interface.
- 4. ProDriver MIDI Output routing block with green connection Depending on if your audio interface is equipped with MIDI I/O, you will see a connection in green. This is representative of the MIDI output channel of the audio interface.

5. Mute routing block

This is a routing block intended for use with the Mute function. Right clicking the block will launch the plug-in pull-down menu for all the available plug-ins - click the desired plug-in to select. To use the block as a "Mute" function, we have created a small 'activate' shortcut button on the ProDriver floating icon. Simply click the "M" button – this will activate or deactivate the function.

Tip: As well as using this facility as a Mute function, you may consider using this for other functions – please insert a corresponding plugin.


6. Voice Over routing block

This is a routing block intended for the use of Voice Over function. Right clicking the block will launch the plug-in pull-down menu for all the available plug-ins. 


Add plug-in and make routing

It is extremely easy to add plug-ins and create routing between input channels and output channels. Simply pull & drag the connection cable from connection point to point. To add a plug-in, right click your mouse, you will see all the available plug-ins that you have in your computer in the pull-down menu, then just click the plug-in to select.




Hardware Connections

Connect the USolo Live digital audio interface outputs to your amplifier or powered monitors. Ensure the Master volume is set to a suitable volume setting.

If you are monitoring through headphones, connect your headphones to the device's headphone output. Ensure the headphone volume is set at a low volume, to ensure ear safety.

Connect your microphone/guitar to the device's analog input.
